

JEFFERY S. HOLMES POST 84

September 5, 2024 MEETING MINUTES

The meeting convened at 1800 hours by Commander Dennis Brown.

Roll call by Sergeant-at-Arms Sam Zucker. Present were: Commander and Judge Advocate Dennis Brown, First Vice Commander and Historian Howard Bixby, Second Vice Commander Penny Johnson, Adjutant and Finance Officer Scott Holmes and Chaplain Luther Johnson. Also present were past Commander Charles Patch and guest Patti Holmes.

Meeting Minutes: Minutes of the August 1, 2024 meeting was read by Sergeant-at-Arms Sam Zucker. Motion to accept by Scott Holmes and seconded by Charles Patch. No discussion. Unanimously approved.

Finance Report:

- 1. Finance Officer Scott Holmes reported that \$355 is due to pay for our liability insurance. All other obligations have been paid.
- 2. The report was accepted and filed for audit.

Membership:

- 1. The Post has 20 paid members and 19 pending.
- 2. There is ongoing membership recruitment.

Americanism:

- 1. The Hartford Heroes Banner Project has mounted 10 banners. Thanks to all that have supported this endeavor!
- 2. Commander Brown, the Banner Committee Chairperson, reported that the town's policy states there can be 18 banners per village. The Banner Committee has contacted the town and they have volunteered to be the fiscal agent. As a result, fund raising will begin in the spring for the extra banners. Some committee members are thinking of being present with a sample banner at the Hartford Hurricanes Football Patriots Night to promote the project. The Committee has petitioned the Town to extend the display time from 60 days, which would be to October 31, through to Veterans Day, November 11.
- 3. Patti Holmes reported that Chief Cooney confirmed that a container is in the lobby of the Police/Fire Department building for worn out or damaged Flags that need to be retired. The hours of accessibility are Monday through Friday, 8 AM 4 PM.
- 4. The Blue Star Memorial field maintenance is ongoing. Thank you to Penny and Luther Johnson for the most recent cleanup.

Children and Youth:

- 1. Scott Homes reported that Coach Dylan Spencer has suggested that Post 84 sponsor the 2025 playoffs. Discussion followed on the feasibility of our Post being the hosts for the 2025 playoffs. The decision was made to wait until Scott can contact Dylan to get parent feedback since most of the volunteers will have to be the parents.
- 2. Scott stated that some minor rule changes will be in effect for the 2025 season so that league play will be in-line with National.
- 3. Charlie Patch reported he will contact the person who attended the Girls State conference to speak at our next meeting.
